

Magnanimous Donation by Alumna Dr.G. Vijayalakshmi



The annual interest incurred on the amount will be spent on organising a lecture every year by an eminent speaker. Dr. G. Vijaylakshmi obtained her master's degree in English from Osmania University in 1999-She did her Ph.D. on "The Theme of Female Suffering in Indian Short fiction in English Translation" under the supervision of Prof. P. Hari Padma Rani and obtained her Doctoral degree in 2009 from Sri Padmavati Mahila University. She subsequently did a UGC sponsored post doctoral for five years from 2013 - 2018 on "Violence against Women". She published two books and 14 papers .She served as a Soft Skills Trainer and as part of that job, toured around 200 Engineering colleges in the undivided state of Andhra Prasesh between 2004 and 2006. 
We are grateful to Dr.G. Vijayalakshmi for her generous donation which will certainly contribute to the long term academic growth of the department.



Soumita Sarkar (Batch of 2000-2002)



I come from a humble family. My father is a self-made man who started everything with a scratch. My mother instilled in me right from the time I gathered my senses that to survive in this world I need to find an honourable means of survival which is possible only through education. I was made to understand the importance of regular studies through many examples from our family history. As a result, I took to paying attention to my studies. Before I could understand the meaning of dream, I had a dream and it was a cliché, to become a doctor. This is not uncommon in an Indian household.

I learned a very essential life skill of adapting myself to any situation owing to my father's all India transferable government job. I entered Kendriya Vidyalaya in class 7th and continued studying till my 12th Board. I had opted Science group in plus two level with Biology, Physics and Chemistry. I got distinction in 12th Board exam and this raised the hope of my parents that I have the capability to compete with many others aspiring to become a physician and topple them to grab a seat in a prestigious medical college. I say you, this hope is quite infectious! I was also infected by the passion of donning the coveted white coat and stethoscope. Alas! I was too young to understand that God has His ways and we mortals when have expectations too high also have to face the Great Fall sometimes.

I took a drop of one year and joined one of the best coaching centers in Visakhapatnam with my parents' consent. I gave myself to studies for one year. I learned how to fill application for the first time and used my signature as a pro like I had seen my teachers do. I liked my English teacher. I also learned how to rhyme words and used to write poems both in Hindi and English as a leisure time activity. Back then I never thought that one day I would become an English Teacher. I applied for some seven admission tests with examination centers at various corners of the country. My mother with the only dream to see her daughter as a doctor used to sit three hours outside the examination center waiting for me with a dabba of food. We used to rely on our acquaintances' generosity at every corner of the country for that 'one night halt' before or after the exam as with our economic condition then we couldn't afford a stay at a hotel. All of us were more than certain that my name will appear in the merit list. But no such merit list was ever published. I grew dejected and disappointed. It was very challenging for me to accept my failure. My parents stood beside me like rock and motivated me to move on in my life. I took Science in graduation with again a cliché combination during those days- Botany, Zoology and Chemistry. While in first year of graduation I joined the Brilliant Coaching in Chennai with my scholarship money. This educational scholarship was offered by the department where my father worked for scoring distinction in 12th Board examination.

The day result of All India Pre Medical Test was declared the air in our home in Sriharikota then was sober. I was devastated. Again my parents consoled that they were satisfied that I had put in my efforts and the result was not in our hands. I moved on once again. This time with a hope to get admission in M.Sc. Chemistry I started afresh. I wasn't prepared to do Masters in either Botany or Zoology. I didn't have any reliable person who could guide me in my career in our family. I could have got a seat in a collage in Maharastra for Chemistry with my combination subjects but was unaware then. I applied at REC, Warangal but failed as few seat were there for general caste candidates.

I was dread against taking one more year's drop preparing for Masters Entrance examination. Finally one of our neighbours Mr. Naushad told us about Sri Padmavathy Mahila University. He got the prospectus also and I found two courses of my choice there, MA English Language & Literature and the other being Master in Communication & Journalism. On consultation with elders I was suggested to apply for MA English. MA English course was and now also thought to be a traditional course of study. But the big question was- How could a meritorious Science student join Humanities stream? Seriously this question was of grave concern; I had to answer this question many a times in the next course of my life; almost for the next ten years or so. Even during my 'Pelli Chuupalu' which literally means the marital negotiation. I was prepared to face the consequences of the change in stream; may be my tenacity impressed Lord Balaji and by His grace I was selected for the interview by the Department Of English, SPMVV. I was selected and got admission in MA English.

It's been twenty years now since I joined Padmavati University. My two years of stay in the University campus while pursuing my Masters taught me many valuable lessons of life. For the first time I was away from home and all things I had been enjoying since childhood in the warm and protected shelter of my parents. As I already mentioned adjustment was not an obstacle for me. Yet home sickness is something that every student must feel to appreciate the blessings of staying with family in home. One prominent change was the transformation of a perspective that I had developed while studying Science. Instead of dissecting a leaf looking for its venation, stomata opening and margin; I began to appreciate the beauty of the leaf. I began to observe the slow movements of the same leaf in wind and under the rain drops. This paradigm shift in the thought process was the result of those lengthy conversations with my compassionate friends who helped me to handle the trauma of switching over to Humanities from Science. But now I know that change of stream from Science to Humanities was not a setback but a blessing. My friends had come to do Masters after doing their graduation in English. Considering this fact they had an edge over me as a student of Literature. I accepted the challenge and studied hard. My professors instilled in me the love for

Literature. Our batch staged two English dramas under the abled guidance of our professors. I took part in Leadership Training programme and also represented University in the Cultural Exchange Youth Festival funded by Ford Foundation. I witnessed many educationist and scholars in their own fields delivering speeches with élan. I used to be awe stuck at times and hoped one day I too would deliver such speeches. I even participated in Nation Group Dance Competition held at Kerala University along with our troupe. I can converse in Telugu well till date, credit goes to my two year's stay in university campus. The foundation of friendship that was laid in campus is still strong.

I never missed a class. My professors were (are) sincere, dedicated and approachable. They were always ready to help us in every possible ways. The thought never entered my conscious that I never studied Literature in graduation. All credit goes to my professors who made my entry into the realm of Literature so smooth and simple. I spend most of my leisure time searching for books and preparing notes in the library. But Vidya Laxmi's preparedness was better than me so she received the Gold Medal and I stood second in the final examination. Before the results were declared I was already appointed by a private degree college in Mancherial, Adilabad district as a Lecturer in English. I did my Bachelors in Education from Dibrugarh University and clenched the Gold Medal. After that there was no looking back and since then I have been teaching English in various colleges, institutions and schools in different parts of the country successfully. I enjoy teaching. My students like me, respect me and never stop from letting me know now and then that they still remember me. This is the greatest gift of being a Teacher. We get the opportunity to touch the lives of so many students in innumerable ways. The Late President of our country, the Missile man, Sri A.P.J. Abdul Kalam said

"Teaching is a noble profession that shapes the character, caliber, and future of an individual"

If I don't get a chance to teach for some reasons I start feeling a strange emptiness. Teaching is in my blood it comes effortlessly to me. I understood that there is a difference between dream and delusions. May be I was never born to become a doctor. Now I am free of all guilt conscious for not being able to fulfill my parents' expectations. They also feel proud of me. I am presently working as a PGT English in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya. In June 2019 I qualified UGC-NET and in December 2020 enrolled in PhD course in School of languages, Gujarat University. I seek blessings from my beloved teachers so that I can complete my Ph.D.

Wherever I stand today or whatever I am today as a person or as a professional everything I owe to my Alma mater Sri Padmavati Mahila University. I have preserved all my notes till date as they are so precious to me. How can I miss this opportunity to pay my gratitude to this great institution that had changed the entire course of my life? I thank wholeheartedly to the Department for giving me this opportunity to share the things which had been hidden deep in my heart for years waiting for an opportune time to come out. I am privileged to be taught and guided by the professors of English Department. Recently when I had a telephonic conversation with Prof. Hari Padma Rani madam, I was overwhelmed as a result couldn't stop the outburst of tears as I felt so emotional to talk to my mentor after so many years. It was even more touching when madam told that she remembers me and mentions my name to the present batch while taking class on the topic Practical Criticism. I thank all the members of the Department once again including those who are not presently working for instilling values in me and teaching me more than what is written in books. Such knowledge cannot be acquired anywhere else. I have discovered my truepotential through your teachings.

I congratulate the entire team and the English Department for bringing out the newsletter English Mahila and pray to the almighty that this great institution should continue its good work and continue to transform lives as it has done in my case.
